

# Steam sterilising feeding equipment

## Maternity, Neonatal and Children's Ward Departments

**Patient Information Leaflet** 

#### Introduction

Microwave sterilising is the recommended way of sterilising infant feeding equipment in a hospital environment. Equipment includes hospital breast pump kits, baby's own bottles, teats and dummies.

Each baby will have a labelled plastic tub with a lid to store equipment ready to be sterilised.



In the box you will have a toothbrush to clean equipment, a sterilising bag and feeding equipment as required.



#### How do I prepare equipment to be sterilised?

- Use washing up liquid, hot water and the toothbrush provided to thoroughly clean the equipment in the washing up sink.
- All components should be taken apart and washed individually.
- Rinse with cold water.

• Tick the numbered box on the bag with a pen. This keeps track of how many times the bag has been used. Bags can be used 20 times.



• Place the equipment into the sterilising bag.

• Measure 60ml of cold tap water using a bottle, add this to the bag and then seal the bag.




### How do I sterilise the equipment?

• Place the bag into the microwave and put it on full power for three minutes.



- Allow to cool for two minutes before removing from the microwave. Please take care as it will be hot.
- Hold the green corner (safe grip) as this is the cool part of the bag and remove it from the microwave. Use a heat resistant glove if you wish.
- Empty excess water into the sink through the red steam vent, taking care as you do this.



- Wash and dry your hands before removing the equipment from the bag.
- Your equipment is now ready for use immediately.
- Always sterilise your equipment just before you are ready to use it.
