## COMMENT FROM PAULA CLARK, CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

Following recent interviews, 16 midwives (13.8 whole time equivalents) were offered positions at the Trust. Recruitment to the Maternity Unit is on-going. We will continue to use the Trust's staff bank, as well as community and specialist midwives, to cover short-term vacancies.
