## COMMENT FROM PAULA CLARK, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

Planning permission has been approved for the Trust to build a pharmacy adjacent to the main entrance of Russells Hall Hospital to process outpatient prescriptions.

The new outpatient pharmacy will improve patient experience by reducing the amount of time they have to wait for their medicines and allow dedicated pharmacy staff to focus on the needs of outpatients.

They will also be able to improve patients' understanding of their medicines via increased clinical contact including use of a bespoke counselling area.

Some specialist medicines such as those for cancer patients can be supplied direct to patients' homes via the new Pharmacy.

The existing Pharmacy Department can concentrate on the needs of hospital inpatients and hence improve the effectiveness and efficiency of these services.
