Thank you for requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Request

Please complete the table below relating to spending on absorbent continence products within your NHS Trust in the last 5 years.

Response

Q1. In your Trust is there a "cap/limit" on the number of absorbent continence pads provided per patient in each 24-hour period, if so, what is the number?

Due to the improved absorbency of the excellent Abena product we use 3 products in 24 hours should be safe and effective for heavy incontinence providing the correct size/ absorbency is prescribed based on fluid intake. For 3 in 24 hours to be enough - the pad must not be changed prematurely- only changed when the blue indicator line is complete. The high absorbency pads hold 800 mls. We recommend a fluid intake of 1500-2000 mls. In most cases this should be enough. If the nurse doing the comprehensive assessment deems it clinical required for 4 pads a day this can be prescribed and will be authorized by the continence team nurses if appropriate.

Q2. How much has your Trust actually spent on absorbent continence products during each of the last 5 financial years, and what is the annual budget for absorbent continence products during each of those years? Please give a figure for each year 2018/19, 2019/20, 2020/21, 2021/22, 2022/23.

Q3. What is the total annual number of patients in receipt of absorbent continence products in your trust? Please give a figure for each year 2018/19, 2019/20, 2020/21, 2021/22, 2022/23.
